#### Front Cover 1929 DA Dodge Six.



Specifications: 208 cu in (3.4 litre) L head seven bearing. 63 HP. 4-wheel hydraulic brakes. 3 speed transmission. 3.8:1 diff ratio. Built by Chrysler.

The Dodge was located on a farm near the wheatbelt town of Miling in 1979. It was in a very dilapidated state. The rear half of the body was missing, and the car had been used to pump water from a dam. It had a water pump



mounted next to the gearbox.

Over 8 years of restoration, parts were obtained from a parts car in Stoneville also from another 4 vehicles, found in Albany and Harrismith in WA. The rear tub came from the Blue Mountains in NSW.

The parts that could not be found, I had to make, including the rear doors, door



hinges and bumper bars. In those days foundries were quite plentiful. The Carine Tafe College proved to be a valuable training ground for body panel and spray-

painting skills. Several other VAA members and past members attended the courses in the early 1980's. Most members restored their own cars in those days.

Mechanically the Dodge was generally complete, but number 6 conrod big end bearing was virtually non-existent. A replacement conrod from a wreck saw 8 years of service before a complete engine overhaul by past member Rob Stewart in 2003.



The Dodge was painted Beige and Black and after 7 years the Dodge was finally concessionally licensed. The first run from the causeway to Fremantle then home was in the rain and without a hood. It ran very well. I spent



the next year fabricating the hood frame from tubular steel table legs and exhaust pipe. The fabric was fitted by a 90-year-old Dutch craftsman.

The car was used extensively in the 80's and 90's and was even on full registration for a period when it was used for weddings.

In 2010 the paint was starting to deteriorate. The national bi-annual Dodge Brothers rally and Bay to Birdwood in South Australia was looming, so off came the body for another strip down and respray, this time in Jaguar Grenadier Red and Volvo Wine. Trailered to Adelaide we completed the Dodge Brothers rally and Bay to Birdwood Run without a hitch. The Dodge has now completed 3 Dodge Brothers runs, each lasting about a week and several hundred kilometres.

Having been on the VAA register continually for 46 years, I believe that the Dodge is the longest serving vehicle in the VAA.

istoric Commercial Vehicle Club of WA invited the Vintage Automobile Association of WA to join them for a Thursday run. The weather was perfect, 22 deg and overcast.

First, we will assemble at Brian Brookes's place in Byford, then at Marley's Transport Yard.

9 cars from our VAA club and 10 trucks from the HCVC club.













In Brian's workshop/sheds, one could find several trucks, restored and spray painted by him over the years.

Quite a collection as the photos show. We did not find out the story behind the Gofers. (motorized seats).

By the way one of the trucks is the one he last used hauling freight around WA and Eastern States. The Prime-mover has over 2 million kilometers on the clock and looks ok to take another road trip.

Around 10:30 a.m, all cars and trucks lined up on the street, ready for the trip from Byford to Marley's Transport yard on Armstrong Road, Hope Valley.


I ended up between two trucks, tail lights in front and two big headlights in my rear mirror, with the occasional shadow of the vehicles running on my right in the opposite direction.

When arriving at Marleys Yard we were greeted by Frank Marley the owner, and promptly guided into a 4 line formation around his own vintage car. Holden Monaro given to himself on his 50<sup>th</sup> birthday I am guessing he is now 75 years old. All the cars and trucks are sitting pretty in front of his rather large workshop and office building.



Frank invited all to join him in the lunch room, for an early lunch with coffee or orange juice to wash it down. There Frank introduced some of his family and staff members and their role in the business. After 1 hour of lunch, we all followed him to the workshops for a thorough inspection of how to keep some 90 primover and 200 trailers rolling on





He led us around to the grain sheds, fabrication workshop, then on to Milne feed sheds and pallet loading facilities. Marley's Transport has been operating for 55 years, solely by the family. The interesting add-on is several years ago Marley

Transport assembled, in Merredin WA, the world's longest road train ever done. Starting with a Kenworth bobtail truck, twin steer, and tri-axle drive (all up weight 39t) fully loaded with gravel. Then hooking up some 45 trailers behind. All up

weight 603 tonne. Marleys Transport held this title for several years. (See page 8 for details of the Road Train Record)

At the end, Brian Tucker, president of the VAA club presented Frank with a copy of our VAA 50-year history book. We believe Frank likes to read books to settle the nerves after a hard day's work.

Big thank you to the Marley family for giving us an interesting tour and insight into the fight for survival in the early years of road transport, constantly fighting the WA Railways for freight to cart.

Thank you also to the HCVC club, who invited us to join them on this run.


#### Club Workshop


